COORDINATOR'S REPORT

February 2015

Non-Motorized Facilities Plan out for Review

All copies of the Clinton County 2015 Non-Motorized Facilities Plan are out to various parties for review. The plan was delivered to the Road Commission, Sheriff's Office, Planning Commission, and member of the Clinton County Trails Advisory Council. I am expecting review letters to start coming in during February. We have already seen our first response from MDOT as well. After the initial review recommendations arrive, I will prepare a document for the PGSC to review and compare with their own recommendations.

Ice Fishing at Clinton County Parks

The ice fishing at Clinton County Parks is being enjoyed by many during the weekends and at the end of weekdays. Users are taking advantage of both Big and Little Clinton Lakes along with Searles Lake in Motz Park.



Bill Earl Youth Fishing Day

Motz and Clinton Lakes County Parks will be hosting one of the follow-up fishing days for the Bill Earl Youth Fishing Program, put on Fishin' Michigan (formerly the Mid-Michigan Steelheaders). Fishin' Michigan has decided to use Hawk Island Park (Ingham) for the three main program days and branch out to "new" parks for the three follow up days. The program will be a step up from the three main program days and will teach participants to clean and cook their catch along

with some new fishing techniques. Clinton County looks to provide enough participants in the future to host one of the main program days as well.

Water Pollution Signs

Rachael Loucks, the Watershed Coordinator at the Eaton Conservation District has provided Clinton County with three all weather metal signs to be placed near the trailheads at CLCP and Motz Park. Part of the popular "Pollution Isn't Pretty" campaign, these signs are to remind users to clean up after their pets in order to keep the water free of bacteria. The signs will go up when the ground has softened in late Winter/early Spring. She also provided the county with informational material that can be rotated through the news billboard at Motz Park throughout the season. All signs and materials were provided free of cost to the county.
