## COORDINATOR'S REPORT

### Legacy Projects

The CSUS 301 Community Engagement course at Michigan State University will once again take part in assisting the Clinton County Parks and Green Space Commission with its efforts in photomonitoring at the native grassland site south of Clinton Lakes Park. In addition to taking pictures, the group has also discussed creating a detailed "story" of how the project came to be, the wildlife and recreational benefits it will provide, and the future of the project site. This will prove vital in future grant applications to prove the continued success of the Commission.

### Juvenile Court Service Group

Two youths from the Clinton County Juvenile Court spent an afternoon at Motz Park moving the picnic tables inside of the pavilion in order to store them for the offseason. The group did an excellent job and may help with periodic off-season trail cleanup projects beginning this year.

### MSU Service Group

Three students from Michigan State University completed their student service project at Motz and Clinton Lakes County Parks. The group cleaned and prepped all of the picnic tables for staining, removed litter from the trails, and surveyed the park to offer recommendations for future sustainable uses.



### Vault Toilet Projects Underway



The Ovid-Elsie Middle School Buildings and Trades class began their work on two vault toilets that will serve visitors to Motz and Clinton Lakes Park year-round. The group has successfully completed a number of projects for Sleepy Hollow State Park in the past and expressed interest in building the pedestrian bridges that would connect Clinton Lakes Park to the native grassland project site.
